KEVIN SLOAN

Creates a Fantasy World

Curiosity and levity mark the work of Denver-based painter Kevin Sloan. His surrealist and carnivalesque tableaux depict animals in unlikely scenarios, posing a dichotomy between nature and the industrialized modern era. Kevin earned his BFA from Tyler School of Art at Temple University in Philadelphia and has since lived and worked in cities across the United States, including San Francisco, New York, Santa Fe, and New Orleans.

Chloe McCarrick is a London-based photographer and printmaker exploring the boundaries of image production. Her alchemical process involves experimenting with hand-painted pigments and darkroom chemicals to make chemigrams of collaged elements, which are then painted over with copper or gold leaf. Chloe's works often depict mythical and historical female figures in iconic, circular formats, celebrating the contributions of often unsung heros.



Alexander meticulously works through each page, cutting out some illustrations while leaving others, to create complex compositions with depth and uncanny dynamism. For Alexander, his collage practice illustrates the reinvention of objects and reconstruction of memories brought on by the passage of time.





KAROLINA MASKIEWICZ


Puts Art Into Motion

- Karolina developed her eye for form and structure studying fashion design at the Fashion Institute of Design and Merchandising in Los Angeles.
- She has had numerous solo shows at Ochi Projects in Los Angeles, and she has participated in the Untitled Art Fair San Francisco and the LA Art Show.

Based in Los Angeles, Polish sculptor Karolina Maskiewicz creates work ranging from ambitious installations to outdoor sculptures and kinetic mobiles. Inspired by Alexander Calder's mobiles, Karolina's works are rooted in her conceptual interest in juxtaposing manmade and organic materials. Her latest body of work, "Woolsey," incorporates pieces of charred wood collected from the remains of her former Malibu studio, which was destroyed in the Woolsey fire in California in 2018.

JESSE HICKMAN

Prefers Materials with a History

"IT'S IMPORTANT FOR ME TO USE MATERIALS WITH A TANGIBLE HISTORY—USED COFFEE BEAN BAGS, DISCARDED WOOD PALLETS, CONSTRUCTION SCRAPS. WITH ALL THEIR SCARS, FOLDS AND SPLITS I'M CHALLENGED AND GUIDED, ACCEPTING THEIR GIVEN STATE AND SAVING THEM FROM A LANDFILL OR BURN PILE."

Michigan-based artist Jesse Hickman layers "found objects" with materials such as tar, carbon paper rubbings, house paint and charcoal. Influenced by Outsider Art, his works on paper—which are actually empty coffee bags that have been cut open and primed—developed first as blueprints for three-dimensional works in wood, and have since become a central focus of his practice. Adding color into the mix of strong lines and shapes, Jesse's abstracts are uniquely playful while maintaining an architectural quality that appeals to a broad audience of collectors worldwide.

- Beginning his career in Illinois, Jesse received his degree in Photography from the Institute of Design in Chicago.
- He has exhibited his award-winning works in solo and group exhibitions in New York, California, Florida, Illinois, Michigan and Texas.


